RESIDENT PROFILE

- · Males and Female, Ages 6-17 years old
- Diagnosis of an Autism Spectrum, Intellectual Disability or other Neurodevelopmental disorder
- Must have a co-occurring DSM-V Psychiatric diagnosis
- Less intensive and less restrictive clinical settings have been attempted without success and/or have been ruled out due to safety concerns
- Evidenced need for highly structured environment due to inability to maintain stability in a community setting
- Parent/guardian must consent to treatment and is able/willing to participate in treatment as clinically necessary
- May consider complex medical needs on a case-by-case basis

FACILITIES & AMENITIES

Norris Academy is located off Exit 122 on I-75 in Andersonville, Tennessee in a state-of-the-art program designed with the unique needs of our residents in mind. Each unit serves between 6-12 residents with community space for residents to engage in group therapeutic activities, recreational activities and healthy social and community interactions with similar-aged peers. Our program offers a comprehensive Sensory Integration room and multiple indoor and outdoor recreational spaces that are available to residents throughout the day to support selfregulation and to promote opportunities for healthy engagement in pro-social activities.

In addition, Norris Academy also has:


- Seven classrooms that offer developmentally- appropriated educational intervention consistent with the residents' developmental and intellectual needs.
- Registered Behavior Technicians for increased support and skill-building for highly vulnerable or at-risk residents.
- Nurse's Station designed to provide medication management, promote hygiene skills and manage difficult medical or physical needs.



EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMING

At Norris Academy, we provide quality, individualized education to each of our residents based on their developmental and intellectual abilities and potential. Many of our residents come to Norris Academy with Individualized Educational Programs (IEPs) and our group of state-certified Special Education teachers work with and adapt these plans to ensure that residents' needs are able to be most effectively met. Classrooms are small, structured environments ranging from 6-12 students in each classroom.

In addition to more traditional educational opportunities, Norris Academy also offers *hands-on vocational training* for students who may benefit from a more applied approach to learning. At Norris Academy, we believe that educational opportunities are critical to helping our residents develop into healthy adults and we operate a year-round educational program to best serve the needs of our students.
